FOR TROOPS, TEAMS, CREWS, AND POSTS CAMPING TWO NIGHTS

On Friday, September 24th, your unit should arrive as a group at your designated parking lot at your assigned time between 4:30 and 8:00 PM.

- Buses will be provided to transport your campers and leaders to your Sub-Camp as a group. Please ensure that everyone in your unit is transported together. (Note: if you must have late arrivals, they can only arrive on Saturday morning by 12:00 noon.)
- A Commissioner will greet your unit at your parking lot and assist you with your bus transportation.
- A Commissioner will greet your unit upon arrival at your Sub-Camp and assist you with moving into your campsite.
- These same procedures will be followed in reverse on Sunday for your departure.

SUNDAY MORNING

From **9:30 A.M. until 1:00 P.M.**, buses will transport departing campers from their Sub-Camps to their remote parking lots.

POLICY FOR PARTICIPANTS LEAVING AND RETURNING

Note: *While it is encouraged that all campers (youth and adult) stay at the Campout for the duration of the event, it is recognized that circumstances may dictate that someone must leave and later return. For safety and security reasons, it is essential that the following procedures be followed. Your understanding and cooperation is greatly appreciated.*

- It is highly encouraged that all campers stay at the Campout from their arrival until its conclusion.

- All personal vehicles will be parked in designated remote parking lots. No personal vehicles will be allowed at the Campground or at Naish Scout Reservation. All roads around the Campground and Naish SR will be closed to all but local residents and approved Campout support vehicles.
- Transportation to and from the Sub-Camps and the designated parking lots will be by provided buses.
- If a camper has no other choice and must leave during the Campout, a 'Departure Permission Form' (which can be found in the Appendix) must be completed and signed (by a parent if for a youth member) prior to arriving at the Campout.
- A departing camper must report to the Sub-Camp bus stop for transportation to the parking lot.
- A Commissioner will be at the Sub-Camp bus stop to check the 'Departure Permission Form' before allowing the camper to board a bus.
- If the departing camper is a Cub Scout, he must be accompanied by his adult partner.
- If the departing camper is a youth, the responsible adult (at least 18 years of age) listed on the 'Departure Permission Form' must meet him/her at the time of their de-boarding of the bus at the parking lot. If the responsible adult is not present, the youth camper will be returned to the Sub-Camp and re-admitted to the Campout.
- Another Commissioner will meet the departing camper at the parking lot and secure a signature from the responsible adult confirming that the youth camper is now their responsibility.
- If the departing camper is an adult, the steps outlined above will be followed with the exception that the adult can sign themselves out.
- The camper will return to their designated parking lot to be picked up by a bus to return to the Campout. A Commissioner will meet them at the parking lot to confirm their return.
- Another Commissioner will meet them upon their arrival at the Sub-Camp to see that they safely return to their campsites where a leader will acknowledge their return.
- It is critically important that we know at all times who is on site and who has departed.

PROCEDURES FOR ACTION AREAS/MIDWAY & DISPLAYS/CHALLENGES

BOY SCOUTS

On Saturday morning, half of the Boy Scouts in each of the Sub-Camps will attend their designated Action Area by patrols and participate in the many and varied activities being conducted there for them.

- At that same time, the other half of the Boy Scouts in the Sub-Camps will attend the Midway and Display Areas by patrols to participate in those events.
- On Saturday afternoon, the schedule will be reversed with Boy Scouts who were in their Action Areas in the morning attending the Midway and Display Area and the Boy Scouts who attended the Midway and Display Areas in the morning participating in their designated Action Areas.

• For Boy Scouts desiring to participate in the 5K Run Challenge, it will begin at 8:00 A.M. at the Midway. Participation will necessitate those runners getting to their Action Area or the Midway/Display Areas later than 8:30 A.M.

- All Action Areas and the Midway and Display Areas will continue to operate during the lunch hours.
- All Boy Scouts will receive a Passport to carry with them on Saturday. As they complete the various activities at

their Action Area and at the Midway and Display Areas they will have the opportunity to have those activities checked off on their card. If they complete 50% of the events available they will receive a special rocker to wear with their Centennial Campout patch on their uniform.

- All Action Areas and Midway and Display Areas will close at 4:30 P.M. for Boy Scouts and they should return to their campsites.

WEBELOS SCOUTS

- On Saturday morning, the Webelos Scouts and their leaders camping with the Troops attending Action Areas will attend the Webelos Action Area to participate in the activities planned especially for them there.
- At that same time, the Webelos Scouts and their leaders camping with the Troops attending the Midway and Display Areas will attend the Midway and Display Areas with them.

- On Saturday afternoon, the schedule will be reversed as described above for the Boy Scouts.
- The Webelos Action Area and the Midway and Display Areas will continue to operate during the lunch hours.
- All Webelos Scouts will receive a Passport to carry with them on Saturday. As they complete the various activities at the Webelos Action Area and at the Midway and Display Areas they will have the opportunity to have those activities checked off on their card. If they complete 50% of the events available they will receive a special rocker to wear with their Centennial Campout patch on their uniform.

- The Webelos Action Area and the Midway and Display Areas will close at 4:30 P.M. for Webelos Scouts and they should return to their campsites.
