Just south of 263rd and Jingo Road)

Bear RIGHT (South) onto Ramp (247th Street) for 0.2 mi
Turn LEFT (East) onto 247th for 0.5 mi (over US-69 bridge)
Turn RIGHT (South) onto S HWY-169 [Metcalf] for 2.0 mi
Turn RIGHT (West) onto W 263rd Street for 1.0 mi
Turn LEFT (South) onto Jingo Rd for 0.2 mi
Park & Camporee entrance is on your right (West)
Follow Signs

Driving:
US-69 (South) for 15.5 mi

What: Cooking Contest and Search and Rescue



The theme is the Search and Rescue merit badge, and all Scouts who finish the requirements, including ICS-100 that needs to be done before the Camporee, should earn the SAR Merit Badge.

Many different organizations (fire department, police department, emergency, and search and rescue groups) from within our area will be attending and leading the Scouts in earning the SAR MB. Scouts will receive a real hands on training opportunity during the Camporee.

Any Scout wanting to earn the Search and Rescue Merit Badge should go online and complete the ICS-100 online training at <http://www.training.fema.gov/EMWeb/IS/is100.asp>, and bring a copy of your completion documentation to the Camporee.

Meet: 1700 (5:00 pm) at Atonement wearing Class A uniform. (This is a District event so it is important we look sharp in full class A).

Meals: Friday: Sack dinner to eat on ride to camp.
Saturday: three meals cooked as a Patrol, Hot breakfast, cold lunch and a hot dinner.

COOKING CONTEST

2014 Cook-off Rules

The Fall Camporee Cook-off is a chance for individual patrols to show off their cooking skills, to have fun, and enjoy a good meal. Any youth patrol in a unit may submit an entry. However, this is about the Scouts, so only Scout patrols (no adult patrols) can enter the contest.

Rules:

1. All food must be prepared and cooked at the camporee.
2. Each entry must be a complete meal of your choice by your Patrol.
3. When turning in your cooking entry, the following MUST be included:
 - a. Unit number
 - b. Patrol Name
 - c. Name/Title meal
 - d. The recipe for each part of your meal. The recipe should include ingredients, their amount, and preparation instructions
4. Each entry must be at least in servings large enough to feed one adult.
5. All meat must be fully cooked. No dishes including rare or raw meat may be entered.
6. Only members of the patrol are allowed to participate in the planning and preparation of the entry.
7. Judging will start at 6:30 PM on Saturday. All entries must be present at the start of judging.
8. Prizes will be awarded for the following.

- Best presentation
- Grand Prize – Best Taste
